It's a Hebrew phrase that has become synonymous with social action and social justice. 'Tikkun Olam' is a moral imperative for every person to contribute towards improving their

community and the world. It is a value that is integral to the mission of the Hebrew University.

This is the time for Tikkun Olam. We must step up – particularly when lives are at stake. We are profoundly dismayed by Russia's brutal military invasion of Ukraine. Our hearts are with all who have been harmed, have lost family and friends and/or remain at risk.

Considering the threat to lives of academics in the Ukraine, in solidarity, the Hebrew University is offering:

- Immediate financial, emotional, and academic support to HU students of Ukrainian origin.
- To host Ukrainian academic faculty members and researchers for up to four months.
- To allow MA and PhD students at Ukrainian institutes of higher learning to continue their research at the Hebrew University for up to four months.

To enable Ukrainian residents pursuing undergraduate degrees to enroll in our Englishlanguage courses.

HU Emergency Aid for Ukrainian Researchers & Students

Considering the threat to the lives of academics in the Ukraine, and in a show of solidarity, the Hebrew University is offering academic hosting for Ukrainian academic staff and students:

Ukrainian academic faculty members, residents of the Ukraine, who serve in academic institutions in the Ukraine, are invited to continue their research activity within the framework of the Hebrew University (HUJI). The invitation is to stay at the University for a period of up to four months, during which time the University will provide monthly stipends for individuals and for families, as well as free accommodations in the University's dormitories for the four-month period. Guests who require a lab to conduct their research will be hosted in the labs of HUJI researchers.

Graduate Students, residents of the Ukraine, who are studying in academic institutions in the Ukraine, are invited to continue their academic research at HUJI. The invitation is to stay at the University for a period of up to four months, during which time the University will offer monthly living stipends and free accommodations in the University dormitories during the four-month period. Guest students who require a lab to conduct their research will be hosted by HUJI researchers.

Graduate and Undergraduate Students are also invited to attend English-language courses and degree programs. Scholarships and accommodations will be offered to suitable candidates.
